From the Rabbi

As the High Holy Days approach in less than a week, we are all conscious of how our High Holy Days last year were tainted with the pain of September 11.

This year, the High Holy Days surround the first anniversary of that painful and horrific day. When we remember the victims as well as the heroes, we also contemplate our lives since that infamous day. How have we been affected by September 11 and its aftermath? What have we learned since then?

Are we still complacent or have we been reinvigorated? Do we carry a sense of pride or shame in being an American? Have we handled events after September 11 well or poorly?

As we will discuss during our High Holy Day services, this is the time of year for us to examine our own lives. Part of that contemplation needs to be directed toward our American identity. How has that changed? Has it changed? Should it change? How do we carry on the memory of September 11 without allowing the pain to cripple us?



I believe that September 11, 2001 has forced each of us to reflect on our identity as Americans and as Jews. I hope you feel the same way. Over the course of these Yamim Nora'im - these Days of Awe, I ask each of us to come to the Synagogue with our hearts, souls and minds open to the awesome potential that Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur offer us.

I also ask that we come to the Synagogue with a sense of Rachmanis, of compassion, as well. As last year, we will have double services in the evening and simultaneous services in the mornings. Please remember that we are a community and the ushers and security personnel are doing their best to make our experience one of spirituality and of safety. For how we behave with each other is the most important and direct way to demonstrate that we have been touched this past year by the intensity of our world.

I look forward to spending the High Holy Days with you. On behalf of my family, Cheriell, Shira and Raya, we wish you all a very healthy, good and less intense New Year.

Making a Difference Through Education

The new year brings several opportunities for you to make a difference. We need volunteers to usher for High Holy Days. Ushers are critical to successful services, and this is a wonderful mitzvah for our congregation. Call the temple office at 292-0939 if you are able to help out.

Brotherhood will also be serving our ever-popular Pancake Breakfast at 8:00 AM on the first day of Religious School, September 22. If you can help set up or cook, call Dan Winter at 295-3191.

The new school year also provides the perfect opportunity to highlight one of my favorite (and most strangely named) Brotherhood program, the Jewish Chautauqua Society (JCS). JCS is the interfaith educational arm of the North American Federation of Temple Brotherhoods. With tensions in the Middle East at such a high level, first-hand information about Jewish religious practices and beliefs helps non-Jews gain respect for Jews as valuable members of America's multi-cultural society.

The Jewish Chautauqua Society was founded in 1893 to disseminate knowledge about Judaism and its interrelationship with the traditions of other faiths. Based on the belief that prejudice breeds on ignorance born of stereotype, JCS seeks to reduce anti-Semitism by providing non-Jews with opportunities to understand the culture, beliefs and practices of the Jewish people. JCS sponsors accredited courses on Judaic topics on college campuses, conducts interfaith institutes, supports field trips to sites of religious interest, provides book grants and produces educational videos to provide "understanding through education." Since its inception, more than two million students in North America have participated in JCS programs.

There are several ways you can contribute to this amazing program. You will find a line on your Brotherhood Membership envelope (coming in late September) where you can add a supplemental donation, or just drop us a note with your donation if you have already sent in your membership or if you are a member of WOTE and would like to contribute to this program. You can also contact JCS directly (check out their flyers on the Shalom table). Join with Temple Emanu-El Brotherhood in helping this great program make a difference in our community.

At the June meeting, we recognized 2 members of our Temple Community who made a difference last year. Each year, Brotherhood gives the Herb Preis award to a student who shows outstanding academic achievement. This year's recipient was Richard Fleischman. Richard was an exemplary student who has completed 12 years of religious school. Despite the fact that seniors in high school lead very busy lives, with SATs to take and college applications to fill out he always attended TJS on Wednesday nights. His contributions to class discussion were thoughtful and thought-provoking.

Brotherhood also gives the Mike Mollack Spirit Award for the Brotherhood member who shows the greatest commitment to keeping Brotherhood a vibrant part of our community. The winner this year is someone who is always there for Brotherhood events. He was the guiding force for our successful Havdallah, Dinner, and Movie nights. He comes to every cooking event. It is our honor to give this year's Mike Mollack award to Paul Gendler.

Some wonderful new changes have been incorporated in our Religious School that we wish to share with you. The day-to-day administrative duties will be handled by Rosie Pick, School Administrator. Paula Marsh, Religious School Coordinator, will be overseeing our team approach to the school operation, under the direction of Rabbi Dana Magat. Reporting to Paula are four Team Leaders: Barbara Persin, Primary; Ann Roque, Secondary; Joelle Wolf, Hebrew; and Rabbi Magat, Teen Jewish Studies. In addition, we have a wonderful Family Education program facilitated by Sue Maltiel. On Sundays, our Religious School Office will be staffed by Laurie Aknin, Acting School Administrator, and Harriet Reisner, Office Assistant.

This year the theme of our Religious School curriculum is Israel. Every grade will have one Family Education day based on Israel, which will provide an opportunity for you and your child to interact, learn and have fun Jewishly. In addition, our school-wide Family Education Day, scheduled for April 6th, will focus on the recreation of our departure from Egypt, wandering through the desert, and arrival in Israel.

We are in the process of ordering playground equipment for use by the Preschool and Religious School. The Preschool received a grant from the Packard Foundation for this equipment; however, we still need to raise additional funds to cover the cost of the playground.
